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Quick & Easy Bouquet Kit includes; (1) table clamp & holder, (1) 6" hand-tied bouquet form, (1) 4.5" hand-tied bouquet form, (5) stem clips, (2) stem ties, & (1) adapter for other types of bouquet forms. (Finished bouquets are approx. twice the form size)(Addtl. forms sold separately)(US Patent 10,674,676)





Place the C-clamp over the edge of a suitable table or work bench and rotate the thumb knob until the clamp is tightly secured to the table. Adjust the desired height of the L-shaped bracket by loosening the 2 screws and sliding the bracket vertically. Then retighten the screws.



Also provided with the kit are stem clips (shown above) for really small diameter stems or wired accents. The clips will prevent the small diameter items from slipping through the form or falling below the desired height within the bouquet. Simply slide the clip over the wire or stem before inserting into the form.



Insert the stem of the dome shaped flower form into the top opening of the vertical clamp tube as shown above. You can also adjust the horizontal position of the form for your comfort by loosening the screw below the tube, slide the tube/form to the desired position (further or closer to you) and retighten the screw.



Continue to fill the form with your flowers and accents until you can't see any of the form edges and the bouquet has all of the colors and accents that you wanted in their desired places within the bouquet. Don't hesitate to move flowers from one location to another until you have the perfect shape and look that you desired.



Begin inserting your flower stems through the holes of the dome shaped form. If you are new to arranging, you may want to begin with all of your base/support flowers (like roses) & add filler & accent flowers afterwards. Leave empty holes around your base flowers so that you have room to add your other flowers after.



At this point, you can organize your stems to reduce criss-crosses and then use the included stem ties to easily bind the stems together so that they resemble a hand-tied look. When cinched, the ties create a small amount of separation between the flower heads which creates an even more symmetrical ball shaped bouquet head.



Once you have a little practice, you can instead add your filler and accent flowers as you go. Either method will work well and you can always pull flowers out and move them to a different desired location in the bouquet. Not something that would be easy to do without our form.



After trimming the stem ties and cutting the stems to the desired length, you can wrap the stems with ribbon or another adornment if desired. Once completed, simply hold the end of the L-bracket while you slip the finished bouquet up and off of the vertical tube. The form becomes a hidden part of the finished bouquet.
